## **I Love A Parade! - Luke 19:28-40**

This week we look at the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. This event begins what is known as “Passion Week” the final week of Jesus life leading up to his death and resurrection.

We want this week to learn some lessons from the perspective of Jesus who knew and the disciples who believed.

**Jesus Knew**—as we look at this event we see that Jesus knew more than the disciples. We want to see what it was that Jesus knew.

READ: Zech 9:9

Why Did Jesus Have Them Get The Donkey/Foal?

Did this mislead them into thinking He was the King?

Luke 17:20-25

How was Jesus’ view of the kingdom different than theirs?

Luke 18:31-34

What is the importance about vs 34?

**The Disciples Believed**—We now need to look at things from the perspective of the disciples. They saw things different than Jesus.

READ: Luke 19:11

What did the Disciples believe was about to happen?

Luke 19:37—What was the reason for their praise?

John 12:12-19—Why was there such a multitude following Jesus that day?

John 11:45-54—What was the perspective of the Religious leaders toward Jesus? See also Luke 19:39

In his message, pastor made the distinction between the disciples obedience and their trust. Which do you believe should come first? Do we trust and then obey, or do we obey and then trust?

What was the trust of the disciples? Do you think they would have obeyed if they knew different?

**They Gave Unto Jesus**—The crowd threw their garments on the ground for the donkey to walk on, why did they do this?

Was this an act of adoration or of honor?

They gave praise unto Jesus. Look up the following verses to see the praise that they gave to Jesus.

Psalm 118:25-26
