## **Growth Assignment—Week #23**

### **What About It?—Heb 10:26-39**

As we return again to our series in the book of Hebrews, we come once again to another warning that the writer gives to the Hebrews. This is a serious warning that should cause all Christians to wake up and take God seriously. Let's take a look at God's warning and what we should about it.

**Let's Review:** Let's look back on the other warnings that we have seen so far in the book of Hebrews. Read the warnings and write down what you believe the warning to be.

Heb 2:1-4 -

**Stop It!** - The writer warns us about continuing to sin once we know the forgiveness of sin. We must take the sin and Jesus' sacrifice for sin seriously!

**Think About It**—We realize that by God's grace our sins have been forgiven, but God's forgiveness is not to be an excuse to continue to sin.

Having read these verses, what would you say to someone who finds themselves addicted to sin (i.e pornography, lying, slander etc.)

**Remember It**—When we were saved, we turned from our sin to receive Jesus and His forgiveness. What do you remember about that moment of your salvation?

**Take It**—The writer ends this passage again with the great benefit of sticking with your faith. What does he remind them of in order to be an encouragement to them?
