

In our past studies of Isaiah, we have covered fairly large portions of scripture to keep it all in it's context. This week we are looking at only two verses that speak of God's perfect peace that is found in trusting Him. So we will be looking at how we can experience the perfect peace of God!

26:1—In That Day—Once again we see the promise of Isaiah as related to "That Day." Look back at some of the other related passages to see what it's talking about as the perfect peace.

25:9—What will they say in "that day?"

26:1-What will they sing "In that day"?

25:1-What is the mood that is described in these verses?

26:7-12—What are the people saying in these verses?

Do you think that the perfect peace found here is only found "in that day" or can we find it on "other days"?

Is our perfect peace only found in exalting and praising God, or can it also be found in sorrow and difficulty?

When was a time that you experienced the "perfect peace" of God?

Perfect Peace—How do we experience the "Perfect Peace" of God? Peace With God—Rom 5:1—How do we have peace with God? Peace Of God—Phil 4:6,7—How do we have the peace of God? Peace From God— 1 Tim 1:2; 2 Tim 1:2; Titus 1:4—How do we have peace from God?
